

TALMADGE PATRICK "PAT" MAGGARD
Captain, (SC) U.S. Navy

Captain Maggard, formerly of Paintsville, Kentucky, died June 25 of pneumonia at the Virginia Hospital Center in Arlington, Va. He was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Chester Maggard of Paintsville, and the brother of Girden Joseph and Clayton Maggard, who predeceased him.

He joined the Navy in 1942 and assumed duties in financial and logistics management. During World War II he was stationed in New Zealand and New Hebrides in the Pacific.

He was Supply Officer aboard the U.S.S. Mt. Olympus, an amphibious force command ship, and was Navy Offices Accounts Officer, Washington, D.C. Among his many other duties, he was Commanding Officer of the U.S. Navy Finance Center (now known as the Defense Finance and Accounting Service), Cleveland, Ohio; Comptroller at Navy Shipyard, Pearl Harbor, Hawaii; and Navy Shipyard at Boston, Massachusetts. He retired in 1974.

Capt. Maggard graduated from Berea College, Kentucky in 1942. He received a Master's Degree in Business Administration from Harvard University in 1956. He was an Honorary Kentucky Colonel.

Surviving are many nephews and friends, and his wife of 59 years, Helen Maggard of Arlington, Virginia.
